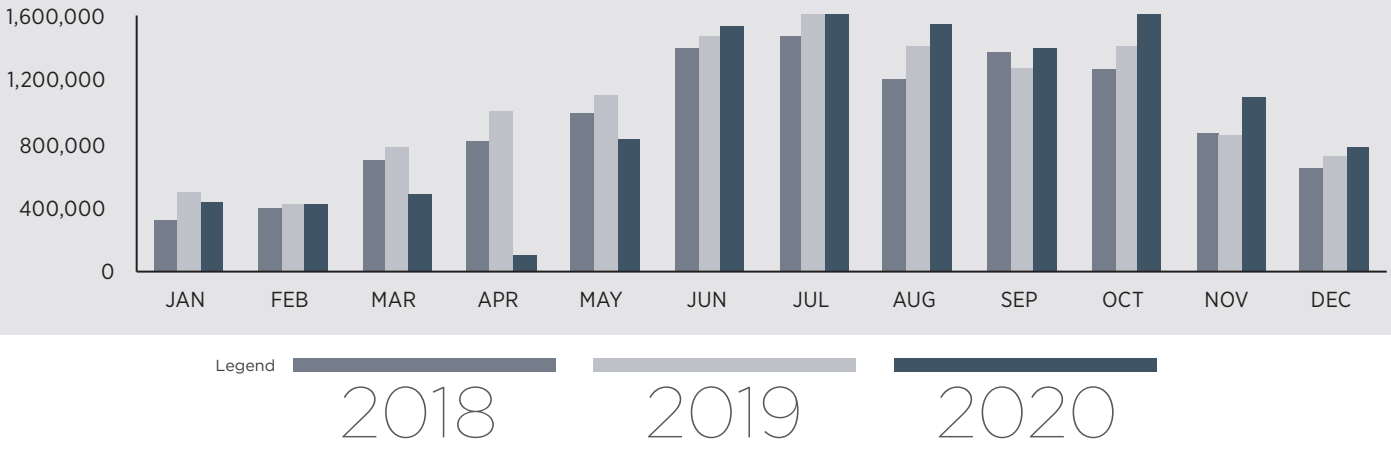


Great Smoky Mountains National Park is the nation's most visited national park, with more than twice the visitation of Grand Canyon National Park, the nation's second most visited park. Annual visitation to Great Smoky Mountains National Park has remained steady for the last decade. Despite a slight decrease in visitation in 2020 due to park closure due to the COVID-19 pandemic, over 10 million visitors still enjoyed the park for the seventh consecutive year.
